Freshman Orientation will look a little different this year due to the ongoing situation with COVID-19. In accordance with CDC and health department guidelines, **we are only allowing incoming freshman students into the HS buildings.** Students will be given a guided tour throughout the building to help students locate their classrooms in preparation for the first day of school. The following process will allow us to keep the number of patrons on campus to a minimum and mitigate contact to the greatest extent possible. We apologize for this inconvenience and thank you in advance for your understanding, cooperation, and support. We are excited to meet our new students and are looking forward to a great year.

ORIENTATION DROP-OFF

We ask that our parents follow the arrival schedule below as they drop their student off in front of the administration building. Here, our counselors will have a table set up in order to distribute class schedules and assist with general questions. HS administrators will also be on hand to answer any questions parents might have as they drop off their student.

ORIENTATION DETAILS

All students will be required to wear a mask while on campus. Students have designated times to attend assigned by their last name. Designated times are listed below. If you are unable to come during your designated time, call the office Tuesday 8am-4pm to reschedule.

6:00 - 6:20 Last Names A - C

6:20 - 6:40 Last Names D - H

6:40 - 7:00 Last Names I - L

7:00 - 7:20 Last Names M - R

7:20 - 7:40 Last Names S - Y

- Students should be dropped off in front of the Administration building. The courtyard area between the Middle School and High School will be blocked off. Each group is allotted 20 minutes, but it should only take students 15 minutes to complete the tour.
- Once students have picked up their schedule, our HS counselors will guide each small student grouping to the HS building so that they can have their temperature checked.
- Once temperature checks are complete, the tour will begin as each of our HS counselors will guide a group of approximately 10 students through our facilities. Freshman teachers will be at their

doors to meet and greet students and staff members will be available throughout the buildings to direct and assist students as needed.

- Once students have finished finding their classes, they can be picked up in the parking lot behind Harrison Field House.
- All students need to bring their school issued chromebooks to school on the first day. If your student needs a device, the required form will be sent home in their 1st day packet.
- *Students need to be sure to note where their 1st hour class is located, because this is where they will be reporting when you arrive on the 1st day of school.*

BACK TO SCHOOL INFORMATION

CAFETERIA

Breakfast will be available each morning from 7:30 - 7:45_{AM}. There are a variety of choices at lunch including the a la carte line. The monthly menus are available online. Any money put on your child's account may be used in the main line or a la carte line.

- Full Price: Breakfast \$1.75 Lunch \$2.50
- Reduced Price: Breakfast \$.30 Lunch \$.40
- If you would like to prepay your child's meals you may pay online or send money with your student. Cafeteria personnel will be taking money in front of the cafeteria at Freshman Orientation.
- To pay online:
 - Go to the school website at www.ftgibson.k12.ok.us.
 - Click the "Parents" button.
 - Choose "Child Nutrition" from the drop down menu.
 - Scroll down and choose "MySchoolBucks.com"
 - Choose "Sign Up Free" and follow the directions to create an online account for your student or you may login to My School Bucks here if you already have an account.

MORNING DROP-OFF & AFTERNOON PICK-UP

Busses will drop off and pick up students in front of the HS building. If you bring your student to school in the morning, you may drop them off at 7:30 in front of the HS building or in the student parking lot. Students can be picked-up after school in the student parking lot.

MORNING ROUTINE

- 1st hour begins at 7:55_{AM}.
- The Cafeteria serves breakfast each morning from 7:30 - 7:45_{AM}. If a student is eating breakfast, then they should go directly to the cafeteria when they arrive.
- Students will be allowed in the building at 7:30_{AM}.

- Temperature checks will be conducted before students enter the building each morning. Students reporting to the main HS building may enter from the auditorium hallway entrance from the student parking lot or the courtyard. Students reporting to the NEB will use the main NEB entry. Each location will have a duty teacher to check temps and direct students.
- After a student passes their temperature check, they will be allowed in the building and should go directly to their first hour class. This process will help with both social distancing and contact tracing. Students will have free time in that class until school starts and may be on their phone, device, read, visit with friends, etc.

*If students have any questions, they may ask any staff member for assistance.

OKLAHOMA'S PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements:

- Students must be an Oklahoma resident
- Enrolled in the 8th, 9th or 10th grade in an Oklahoma high school
- a student whose parents earn \$55,000 or less per year
- Student must complete the 17 units of required courses--which are already required to graduate Fort Gibson High School--and earn a 2.5 GPA or better in those courses

Scholarship Benefits: If the student meets the program's requirements, Oklahoma's Promise will pay his/her tuition at an Oklahoma public two-year college or four-year university. It will also cover at least a portion of tuition at an Oklahoma accredited private college or university or for certain programs that meet the requirements to be eligible for federal student financial aid offered at Oklahoma public technology centers. The scholarship amount, however, does not cover items such as fees, books, supplies, or room and board. Visit their website for more information:
